

Literacy and Communications for 90 minute

Create flashcards for each unit: classroom, math, the school, the parts of the body, food, zoo animals, etc.

- Center 1: Reading new vocabulary /phonics/ dictionary skills, discuss definitions
- Center 2: Speaking sharing and discussing information orally.
- Center 3: Write sentences using the new vocabulary words.
- Center 4: Listen to new vocabulary words/spell.

High School Program

- Qualification for program
 - Does not speak, read or write English
 - Usually has had no formal education in their native language.
 - Below Pre-Lit level when given IPT
- Tests given
 - IPT
 - Math Placement to determine if Basic Math or Pre-Algebra
- Placement by level not age
 - No transcripts
 - Incomplete transcripts
 - Can be a senior with transcripts, but has no English language skills.
- Grades
 - Pass/Fail for Newcomer classes (expedites the learning of English to transition faster in to Pre-Lit classes)
 - Basic Math ABCD (counts as an elective credit if course is passed)

High School Newcomer Curriculum

- Language
 - Follow ELP standards for K-1
 - Listening
 - Speaking
 - Writing
 - Reading
 - After basics are learned, begin to introduce academic vocabulary appropriate for HS
- Basic Mathematics
 - Follow GC District standards for K-2 or 5-6
- Survival Skills
 - Students learn how to become a "high school" student.
 - Paper work, handbook, locations, personnel, programs, schedule, lunch, routines, social atmosphere, activities
 - How to communicate appropriately and respectively

A Typical Day At The High School

- Student Schedule (Even or Odd)
 - Enrolled in "Newcomer" classes that have P/F markings with the same teacher (self-contained)
 - ESL Listening/Conversation (1st period)
 - ESL Writing (2nd period)
 - ESL Reading (7th period)
 - ESL Survival Skills (8th period)
 - ESL Mentoring or ESL Freshman Success if classified as a Freshman (9th period every day)

Enrolled in other classes with letter grades/modified grades

- ESL Migrant tutorial (5th period)
- Some type of PE class (6th period)
- ESL Basic Math Low or other ESL math depending on level/transcripts (3rd and 4th periods)
- ESL System 44 (5th and 6th periods)

Newcomer Classroom At The High School

Even though the Newcomers have a class schedule we begin the program with learning English first.

Listening/Speaking/Writing/Reading

- Overall instructional design begins with phonological awareness and phonics instruction first in isolation then in words and connected text.
- <u>www.abcfastphonic.com</u> (similar to System 44 program)
 - Letter symbols with cognates (if applicable)
 - Letter sounds with cognates (if applicable)
 - Letter-sound correspondences
 - Decoding words
 - Spelling instruction during word learning to connect how sounds map onto print
 - 6 steps to learn a word
 - Vocabulary instruction during word learning to make meaning of the word

What Does A Class Period Look Like?

- Students are at varying skill levels
- Beginning of class: Bell work (questions to review previous day's skills)
- Whole Group to introduce and practice new skill
 - Use of first language dictionaries and picture cards to match cognates and relate to prior experiences
- Small groups to review, apply and master the skill (Initially groups are determined by first language). This helps build confidence and Oracy
 - One small group as guided teacher instruction and reinforcement of the skill
 - Cooperative partner practice
 - Individual practice (iPad, computer, worksheets, manipulatives and language games)
- After 4-6 weeks, students are grouped with different first languages. This makes students use English to communicate with one another.
- BE PREPARED TO BUY OR MAKE MANIPULATIVES, MANIPULATIVES, MANIPULATIVES!

Exiting the Newcomer Program At The High School

- Most students are prepared to enter the Pre-Lit classes after 9-12 weeks in the Newcomer program
- Check list as determined by Pre-Lit classroom teachers
 - Newcomers are assessed weekly to monitor progress in the skills on the list
- Transition to Self-contained Pre-Lit Language classes
 - Keep in mind that each ELP standard states "with support"
 - CWC Teacher/paraprofessional
